CAST OF CHARACTERS:

*Note: The words in parentheses are not spoken; they provide a rough translation for the lines, giving a guide as to how the actors should deliver them.*

*A and B enter from opposite sides of the stage.*

A

Sox. (Hey.)

B

Oh, Sox! Soxy sox sox? (Oh, hi! How's it going?)

A

Sox sox sox. Sox? (Not so bad. You?)

B

Sox. (Good.)

A

Sox soxity-sox? (How's the wife/husband?)

B

Sox. Soxity-sox-sox. (Away. Visiting her/his mother.)

A

Sox soxity? (For how long?)

B

Sox soxy sox! (Not long enough!)

*They laugh. C enters.*

A

Hey, soxy sox-sox! (Hey, look who it is!)

B  
Sox sox soxity-sox. (Ain't seen you for a while.)

A  
Soxity sox? (Where you been?)

C  
Celts.

A  
Sox? (What?)

C  
Celts. Celtics. Celts.

B  
Uh, sox. (Uh, okay.)

C  
Celtics. Celts.

*C exits. A and B stare at each other and then  
burst out laughing.*

A (*tapping his/her head*)  
Soxy sox-sox! (What a weirdo!)

B  
Sox! (I know!)

A and B  
"Celts!"

*They continue laughing.*
